# THE COURTHOUSE

— EST. 2016 —

**T**he Dornoch Court House was designed by Thomas Brown (1806-1872) in the Scottish Victorian renaissance style and was commissioned on February 7th, 1849 for an estimated cost of £2427. For over 160 years it served as the socio-economic centre of the town, but was closed in 2013. We purchased the building in an effort to preserve local history, enhance the visitor's experience and to serve as a catalyst for economic progress. The building has been renamed in honour of Andrew Carnegie and his wife Louise in recognition of their contributions to Dornoch and the surrounding area.

The Courthouse Restaurant, located on the first floor in the former courtroom, is run by proprietor Carol Mackay. Carol is a local to the area having grown up a few miles away in Bonar Bridge. She now lives in Dornoch with her husband and young daughter. She honed her people skills working for the Bank of Scotland for 9 years. When the possibility to own and run her own business presented itself she jumped at the opportunity and her dream of having her own restaurant was born. She has worked tirelessly to build the foundations of The Courthouse and her passion is evident as the business continues to grow and develop.

The interior design nods to the industry where Carnegie amassed his fortune and includes memorabilia from Andrew Carnegie's contributions and relationship with Dornoch and the surrounding area. Andrew and Louise Carnegie's legacy of philanthropy was extraordinary. From 1883 to 1929 they funded over 2500 libraries and other major cultural projects in over a dozen countries. There are over 660 libraries and such projects in The United Kingdom and Ireland. The photographs in the restaurant represent the major philanthropic Carnegie projects funded in their adopted home, The Highlands.

The mural in The Courthouse depicts personalities connected to Dornoch from past and present day. Set in a court scene (as the room was originally laid out) 62 famous and local faces can be seen watching over proceedings. The mural was created by artist Sandy Noble of Brogan arts. Sandy, based in Aberdeen shire, painted the mural in a barn at his home from photographs of the individuals and the room itself. The mural was then cut into 3 sections, rolled and transported up to Dornoch where it was pieced back together creating the fantastic backdrop and talking point to our restaurant.
